
SUPPORTING AND NURTURING GIFTED CHILDREN

Any population of children that develops at a different pace and has certain characteristics has specific needs related to parenting and teaching. So it is with gifted children, who exhibit patterns of development, learning and behaviour that are indicative of their cognitive differences. The characteristics and special support needs of gifted children highlight that parenting and teaching practices must be adjusted in order to address their complex needs. It is important to examine and understand parenting practices that guide gifted children to develop academic potential while ensuring social, emotional and psychological health and well-being.

In today's society, schools and parents are responding to increased expectations and time constraints. Effective partnerships between teachers and parents have become essential to meet the individual needs of children. Building positive connections with schools and educators can lead to your gifted child feeling more supported, with a deeper understanding of learning needs, ultimately leading to better academic outcomes. Parents of gifted and twice-exceptional children often believe that positive communication with schools is important, although sadly it is not always of high quality. How to best build relationships with schools will be discussed.



Michele Juratowitch, Director of Clearing Skies, provides services for gifted children, parents, schools, organisations and institutions. She lectured in postgraduate courses, conducted research, delivered programs for parents and students at CERRIC, UNSW, Michele was awarded a Churchill Feliowship to study gifted children. She is a researcher, author and conference presenter.





Geraldine Townend is a published academic with interest and expertise in the area of twice-exceptionality. A Research Feliow at the Criffith institute of Educational Research, her research focuses on supporting students to aspire to their potential in education. She is writing a book to support students with optimal school outcomes.

For many years the International Directory of Mathematics Educators at <u>http://www.DirectoryMathsEd.net/</u> has helped mathematics educators keep in touch world wide and it is now maintained and updated by Alan Rogerson.

The Directory consists of one Main File, containing all individual names in alphabetical order, and also files listing individuals country by country.

How do names get on the Directory? In general names are not solicited or nominated. Every entry is made only by the individual concerned, and on a voluntary basis. The Directory is OPEN in the sense that there are no strict criteria or requirements for entry, other than an interest and/or involvement in the teaching and learning of mathematics. So it is basically up to each individual to nominate themselves.

It is clear from the hits on the web site that the Directory continues to serve a useful purpose. We warmly invite people who are not yet on the list to enter, and for those on the list to encourage their colleagues to join us, so the Directory can expand and serve a wider audience world wide. Please suggest to your international contacts that they also send in their entries to me, whether or not their country is represented yet, we can easily add new countries.

To be included in The Directory please send to <u>alan@cdnalma.poznan.pl</u> your complete entry in standard format, and I will cut and paste it into the Directory so your entry will be "owned" by you.

For those of you already listed would you be kind enough to verify that all your entry details are currently correct and your email addresses and URLs actually work, and if not could you send your complete updated version formatted exactly as below?

Many of the entries are quite old now and some of you might well have had several promotions since your entry was added.

The standard format in the Directory consists of the following items, all in one continuous line, separated by commas and spaces:

surname or family name, given name(s), email address, postal address, telephone number(s), (and URL(s) if you wish)

Please follow the existing entries precisely in formatting: font Times New Roman, size 12pt. for example:

Ireland Conference 2019

Dear friends and colleagues,

(1) The Preliminary Announcement (PA) for our conference in Ireland in 2019 can now be downloaded in Word or PDF

from <u>Ireland Conference Documents</u>. At the start of the PA (and also at the end of this email) there is a short notice about the conference.

We would be most grateful if you could post this to newsletters, lists and blogs you have contact with.

(2) Please note we have a year and a half to the conference so additional details such as registration fees, deadlines for papers, etc. will be decided in good time in 2018. We wanted to get all other information out early so people who are interested in attending can plan ahead, put the dates in their diary and apply for funding.

(3) So far, even at this very early stage, 240 people have responded to the survey asking for their intentions to attend, of whom 120 said it was certain or probable. We are, therefore, assured of a good attendance, and planning is now moving ahead confidently.

(4) I would like to introduce my co-organiser, Jasia Morska, who has a very strong background in mathematics education in Poland and internationally. Jasia was a co-organiser of our second international conference in Poland in 2001 and since 2013 we have been working closely together on our project and other international conferences and innovative initiatives. 
There are often many considerations for parents to work through such as:
